## EARLY MARRIAGE BOND AND SEAL FOR PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY, VIRGINIA

Prince William County is a "burned record" county. Many of the court records disappeared during the Civil War leaving a number of gaps. There are no surviving original marriage bonds. Our records of marriage begin with 1854, a year after the state of Virginia decreed that all counties were to record births, deaths and marriages and send a yearly copy to Richmond.

The staff of RELIC was very excited to receive the following copy of a marriage bond between William GROVES and Mary SPENCER which took place in 1792. The copy received was the marriage bond rewritten and proved in 1854 by the then Clerk of the Court, Mr. P. D. Lipscomb. This is a marriage that was previously unknown. The discovery was sent to Mr. Scott Parham, volunteer archivist at the County Courthouse in Manassas from Mae Winne, 3774 Essex Avenue, Baden, Pa. 15005, email [mwinne3@attbi.com](mailto:mwinne3@attbi.com). The marriage bond was found in the Revolutionary War papers of William Groves at the National Archives. Ms. Winne has been researching the Groves and Spencer families for over twenty-five years.

The marriage bond comes with an added surprise because it is stamped with the seal of the County in 1854. Unfortunately the seal did not photocopy well but it looks similar to the present day seal. It is oval and looks to have scales and tobacco leaves in its design. We believe this to be the earliest representation of the seal to exist. Hopefully more records will continue to turn up and more light can be shed on the history and people of Prince William County. We welcome any other manuscript discoveries.

### *Transcription of marriage bond:*

Know all men by these presents, that we William Groves & John Hoff are held and firmly bound unto his excellency Henry Lee Esquire, Govenor of Virginia, and his Successors for the use of the Commonwealth, in the Sum of Fifty pounds, current money to which payment well and truly to be made, we bind ourselves and each of us, our[?] and each of our heirs, executors and administrators, jointly and severally firmly by these presents. Sealed with our seals, and dated this fourth day of February Anno Domini 1792. The Condition of the above obligation is such that when thereas there hath been this day

## WOOLFENDEN FAMILY PRESENTS "KOPP, VIRGINIA" BOOK TO RELIC

On Friday, March 8, 2002, the Woolfenden family presented a copy of Raymond ("Cousin Ray") W. Woolfenden, Sr.'s book, *Kopp, Virginia*, to RELIC.

Mr. Woolfenden (9/5/1916-4/21/2000) grew up in Kopp and had many fond memories of this little community, its people, and the Belle Haven Missionary Baptist Church. The government acquired the land during WWII and it is now part of the Quantico Marine Corps Base. According to Casmere W. Kistner, the book was a lifetime labor of love for her father. Within its pages, he shares his personal memories of Kopp as well as information on the families that lived in and around the area (i.e., Woolfenden, Abel, Storke, Miller, Lynn, Cole, Wright, Luck, Taylor, Norman, Dunn, Lowe, Keys, Jones, Wine, Holmes, Mountjoy, etc.); the records of Belle Haven Missionary Baptist Church and its cemetery; records from Holmes School; the post office/post cards with the Kopp stamp; photos; letters; excerpts from Dr. D. C. Cline's business ledger; Highland Lodge No. 252 Independent Order of Odd Fellows, Independent Hill; Kopp newspaper articles from 1867 to 1999, including the taking of the land; a list of families who lost their land and the approximate acreage; and maps of the area. Although the village of Kopp is gone, Mr. Woolfenden's book will ensure that it is never forgotten.

DECLARATION OF TAKING NO. 7

WHEREAS, pursuant to the Acts of Congress approved August 6, 1942 (Public Law 700, 77<sup>th</sup> Congress) and March 27, 1942 (Public Law 507, 77<sup>th</sup> Congress), the above-styled condemnation proceeding has been instituted.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the provisions of the Act of Congress approved February 26, 1931 (46 Stat. 1421), I, Acting Secretary of the Navy, do hereby make and cause to be filed this Declaration of Taking No. 7, and by virtue of authority thereof do hereby state that the lands selected for acquisition aggregate fifty thousand (50,000) acres of land, more or less, located in Prince William, Stafford, and Fauquier Counties, Virginia, and that this declaration of taking covers only 6,740.9 acres of land located in Prince William County, Virginia, designated as the Kopp-646 Unit, which lands are more particularly described on the enclosed Exhibit “A,” and are shown on a map entitled, “Addition to Marine Corps reservation, Quantico, United States vs. 50,000 Acres of Land, Stafford, Prince William, and Fauquier Counties, Virginia, Part “B”, Kopp-646 Unit, 6,740.9 Acres in Prince William County,” revised on May 20, 1943, attached hereto as Exhibit “C” and made a part hereof.

And I do declare said lands to be taken under the authority of the aforesaid Acts of Congress; that the use to which said lands are to be put is the expansion of the Marine Corps Training Area, Quantico, Virginia, as authorized by said Acts; and that the estate hereby taken in said lands is a fee simple title subject to the rights of the public to use, occupy, and maintain Roads Nos. 646 and 619 constituting the northern boundary of the lands described in Exhibit “A,” subject to an easement in favor of the American Telephone and Telegraph Company for telephone lines, subject to an easement in favor of the Virginia Public Service Company for an electric transmission line, and subject to an easement in favor of the Prince William Electrical Cooperative for its main power line.

And I, Acting Secretary of the Navy, acting for and in behalf of the Secretary of the Navy, do hereby state that the sum of money estimated by me to be just compensation for all of said land, improvements thereon, and appurtenances thereunto belonging, is One Hundred sixty-one thousand, one hundred and twenty-nine dollars and fifty-eight cents (\$161,129.58), which said sum is hereby deposited into the registry of the court for the use and benefit of the persons entitled thereto, and that the names of the owners of said property and improvements thereon which are hereby taken are shown on Schedule "A" which is attached hereto and made a part of this declaration of taking.

I am of the opinion that the ultimate award for the taking of said land will be within the limits prescribed by Congress.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the Petitioner, by and through the Acting Secretary of the Navy, acting for and in behalf of the Secretary of the Navy, has caused this declaration of taking to be signed and the seal of the Navy Department to be affixed hereto in the City of Washington, District of Columbia, this thirty-first day of May, 1943.

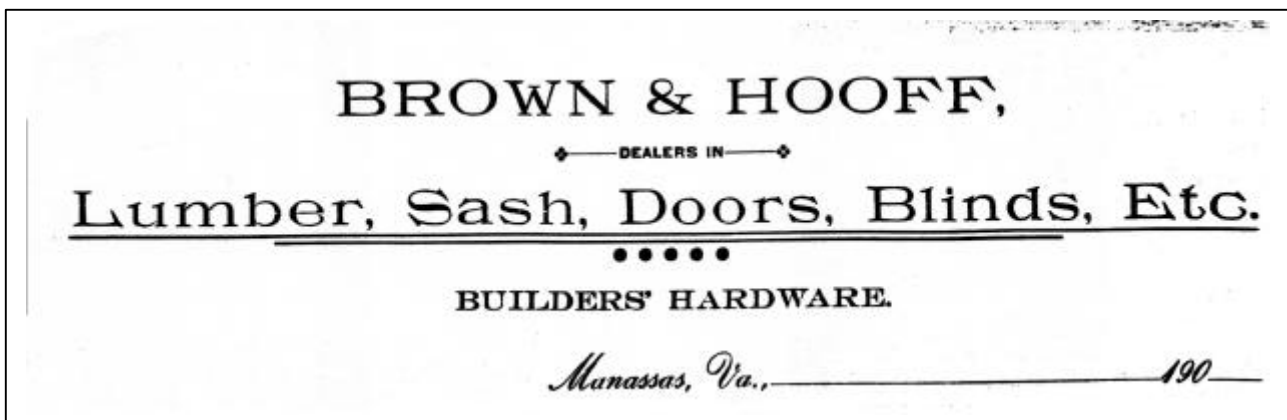

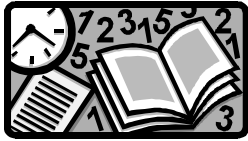

## LOOKING BACK – PRINCE WILLIAM NEWS

### HOW LOYAL VIRGINIANS DESERT THE REBELS

The following are copies of letters to Miss Sylvia Eastman, of this city, from her brother, late of the Prince William Cavalry in the rebel army:

*Washington, Thursday, July 25, 1861*

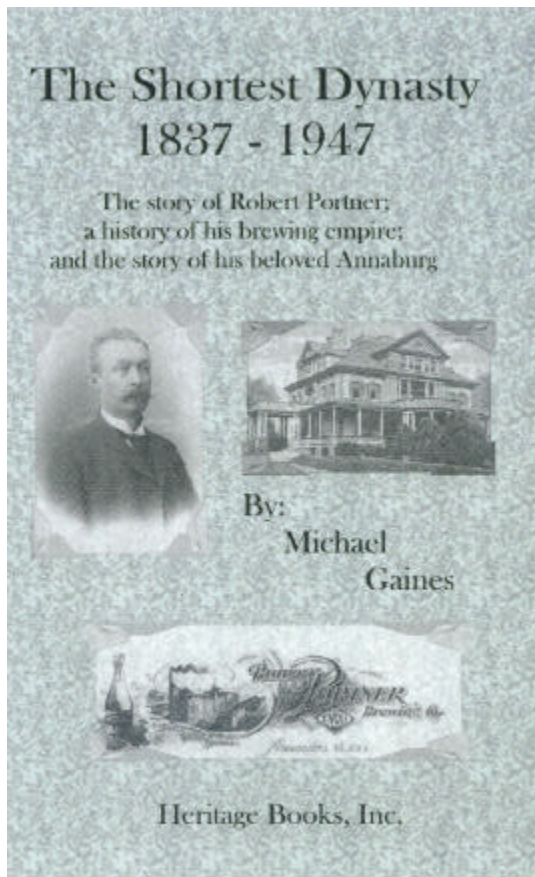
Once more I have the liberty and opportunity to write you. We have seen rather serious times in Old Virginia during the past three months, though as yet, our family have not suffered particularly. Russell you know, had belonged to the Prince William Cavalry for more than a year when the war broke out. April 23rd, he was ordered out to join the Secession Army, but I told him that he could not go, that he must stay at home and see to the business, and I would go as his substitute. Therefore, I went into the Southern Army, but for the safety of the family only. Last week the militia were ordered out, and then he would have to go anyway. On my way to Dumfries, where I was sent with dispatches, I stopped at home and told him, also gave him directions how to escape. After he was safely away, I deserted, and am now here, bound to be revenged. I want to get up a company of as desperate fellows as ever looked down the muzzle of a gun, and go right forward with the National Army. Quite a number are ready, here, and if you know of any such your way, write me, and I will come after them.

July 31 -- I received your letter this morning, and answered immediately, as I know not when I shall again have time to write. You wished me to send a message home for you immediately. It will be impossible to do so until Manassas Junction is taken; then I hope we can communicate with home as often as we wish. In my last I did not tell you how I managed to get away, I believe, and I will do so now. First, Russell and C., together with Mr. Lamb's boys left, as I directed, but the latter, poor fellows, were taken prisoners. The seceders would have given considerable to have caught them all, but Russell and Will put their clothes on a raft, and swam Occoquan Bay, pushing the raft before them, and so bravely escaped. After losing their way several times, and lying in the woods two nights, they at length arrived here in safety, upon learning which I followed suit. I was then sent down to the river to withdraw the guard. Leaving my horse, I walked about three miles to where they were stationed and where they had gone, went out into a field where some Negroes were at work, and ordered them to follow me. We went into a fish-house and took out a boat, which, when put in the water, leaked faster than I could bail with a large pail. We then went in search of old clothes, and finally succeeded in caulking it pretty well. One Negro got in with me, and we started on our voyage with nothing except two pieces of board we found on the shore. We succeeded in this way very well for a mile or so, when there came up a gale, and we were obliged to go ashore again. We laid down for an hour, then started again. This time we got along better, and finally landed five miles above this side of Occoquan Bay, about 1 o'clock A.M. We spent the rest of the night in a field, under a shock of rye, out in the rain. In the morning, again took up the line of march, and walked fifteen miles to Accotink, where I arrived about 11 o'clock, without having had anything

to eat since 6 o'clock on the morning before. You can imagine my condition after going without food so long, and walking and working as I had. We left the crops harvested, with no one to draw them in, or thresh them. I had no opportunity to go home after clothes or anything, and am in rather destitute circumstances, but that I don't mind any, as I am now getting wages enough for my wants. They talk some of making me guide for one division of the Army, and I may have to move soon. It is yet uncertain.

#### **THE SHORTEST DYNASTY: 1837 – 1947** by *Michael Gaines.*

This is the story of Robert Portner, a history of his brewing company and the story of his beloved Annaburg. Robert Portner was a millionaire who lived in Alexandria and Washington and often spent his summers in Manassas, Virginia. He owned what was considered one of the biggest breweries in the South at the time. Robert Portner was born March 20, 1837 in Rhaden, Prussia. He came to America in 1853 and started his legacy. From working in a grocery store in New York he went on to become one of the biggest business men in the country. He married Anna von Valaer in 1872 and they had 13 children. When Robert Portner died in 1906 his estate was worth 1.9 million dollars.

The author gives us a look at his family, their trials and triumphs. He also takes an in-depth look into the brewery business and the many innovations that Robert Portner helped create. We also get to see how that empire crumbled when Prohibition swept the country. The author also takes us on a visit to Annaburg, Robert's beloved summer home in Manassas that he designed for him and his family. Annaburg is believed to have been the first home in the country to have air conditioning,

which Robert invented. We also see what has happened to the many buildings Robert Portner had built and what is standing there today. Filled with wonderful stories and many pictures, the reader will become part of the Portner family.

**POLL TAX LISTS FOR PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY, VIRGINIA  
BRENTSVILLE MAGISTERIAL DISTRICT (1940s)**

Copies of the 1940's poll tax lists for Prince William County are kept in the manuscript holdings at RELIC. The listings give the person's name with a record of which years of the previous three that taxes were paid; thus the list in 1944 included the fees paid for 1941-1944. The lists for the years 1944-1949 have been combined and provide a "census" of those who had paid their poll tax throughout 1941-1949.

The poll tax fee was \$1.50 yearly which had to be paid up for three years at a time. At least six months before the election, a registration application had to be completed in the voter's own handwriting and he or she had to answer questions posed by the registrar concerning the citizen's qualifications as an elector.

Unfortunately, not everyone voted. Less than half of the population paid their poll tax. Not everyone could afford the \$4.50 required to vote. The 1940s was a time when people had to conserve and tighten their purse strings due to World War II. In the general election for governor in 1941, only 401 total votes were cast in Prince William County, yet in the 1940 U.S. Federal Census there were 17,738 people living in the county with 10,708 men and women over the age of 21 eligible to vote. The governor race in 1945 yielded 719 votes, and in 1949, 1,093 votes. Voting for president of the United States had a better turnout. In 1944, 2,108 people in Prince William voted and in 1948, the total number of votes cast was 2,083. The 1950 population of the county was 22,612 with 13,469 people over the age of 21.

On April 1<sup>st</sup>, 2002, the 1930 U.S. Federal Census will be released. RELIC will be getting the microfilm of that census for the entire state of Virginia. Looking at the 1930 Federal Census and the 1940s poll tax lists, we're given a snapshot of who lived in the county for the two decades.

Reported districts in the Poll Tax Lists for Prince William County are Brentsville, Coles, Dumfries, Gainesville, Manassas Town, Manassas District, Occoquan District and Town, and Quantico. Each district for the 1940s decade will be presented in upcoming issues of *Prince William Reliquary*. Brentsville District poll tax lists follows.

## LOST AND FOUND

These Prince William-related documents recently appeared for sale on eBay:

- *Mississippi Stampless Letter dated 1839* – The document was advertised as a “slave” letter containing four pages from F. T. Chevis in Raymond, Mississippi to Samuel A. Marsteller of Prince William County. According to the seller’s listing, the letter concerned the hiring out of Marsteller’s Negro servants and included the following quote, “...for Eliza and child (with prospect of another in a day or two), I got \$125.00 – for Frances \$160.00...”
- *Original Letters dated 1866 from Edward Dorsey Cole* – Two handwritten letters, dated 21 Feb 1866 and 2 Mar 1866, from Edward Dorsey Cole to his sister (probably Annie Cole Tansill of Fredericksburg). E.D. Cole was born in Prince William Co. on 10 October 1843, the son of Horace and Martha Cole. He served in the 15<sup>th</sup> Virginia Cavalry under Capt. Brawner and later became a prominent citizen of Fredericksberg, Virginia.

## 1860 PRINCE WILLIAM CO. AGRICULTURAL CENSUS INDEX

The index to the 1850 Agricultural Schedule and a more lengthy explanation of the Agricultural Schedule can be found in the previous issue. The 1860 contains two more columns than the 1850 bringing the total number of columns to 48. One new column asks about "*Other prepared Hemp*" and the previously combined column about Beeswax and Honey has been separated each into their own columns "*lbs. of Beeswax*" and another "*lbs. of Honey.*" In comparing the two census years, there were 605 farms reported in 1850 but only 582 farms in 1860.
